WHAT'S HAPPENING!


NO SCHOOL LITURGY. There will be no school liturgy this week.



Can I Hold my Breath from Week 2 until Week 5? A Look at the Peak Flu Cases in Louisiana

As long as I have worked with children, I dread week 2 and week 5 of the flu season. I'll tell you why. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) categorizes the weeks of the year to report information on specific diseases by the numbers 1-52. These numbers follow the calendar year. Flu data from Louisiana usually shows a spike in week 2, and the peak of the flu season is week 5 in our state. As you are reading this article, we are in week 3 (Yes, I have been holding my breath for a week.) While Louisiana is still a leader in number and severity of flu cases, our school has lower than usual numbers. I attribute this to a job well done by the parents in vaccinating themselves and their children. Of the children who did get the flu, almost all of the children who had been immunized had very mild cases.

As for week 5, please encourage your children to be vigilant in all flu prevention activities that we have talked about this flu season.
