Our school year is filled with many wonderful events and traditions for our students and their families to enjoy. Coffee and Donuts – The Terrace

Families and students enjoy donuts on The Terrace.

Living Rosary – Sacred Heart of Jesus Church

This long-time tradition is a beautiful service in which our students form a rosary and lead the student body, faculty, and parents in prayer.

Fall Fest–School Grounds

This annual school festival celebrates the end of the first nine weeks. It is a fun-filled day for our school family complete with slides, a photo booth, individual class booths, karaoke, fun activities and more. Parents can visit and make new friends while enjoying great food and seeing their children enjoy all of the activities. The day is a great fundraising opportunity for Sacred Heart Home & School as well as a day loved by both parents and students.

Halloween Carnival –Activity Center

Pre-K – fifth grade students and their families are invited for a fun-filled evening of games, costume contests, and more hosted by the Sacred Heart Youth Group.

Fall Pep Rally –School Gym

Show your Sacred Heart spirit and attend our Fall Pep Rally hosted by the cheerleaders and recognizing athletes participating in fall sports.

Book Fair Family Day - School Library

Join us before or after church to shop our annual book fair. Scouts are honored during our 11 a.m. Mass.

Grandparent's Day - School Gym

Grandparents of Sacred Heart students are invited to this themed celebration in their honor. Each student's class participates in the program and the morning culminates with cookies, lemonade and classroom visits.

Christmas Tree Decorating and Sing-A-Long –School Gym

The entire school comes together in anticipation of the Christmas season with this special assembly. Each grade performs a special Christmas song and decorates two Christmas trees with ornaments made by each student. All parents are invited to join us and sing along.

Fourth Grade Mardi Gras Parade - School Gym

One of the most festive events of the year, this fourth grade project is fun and educational. The fourth-graders present their projects and parade their homemade wagon “floats” in front of all grades and families. After the parade, students line the school yard as the fourth grade students shower them with beads.

Living Way of the Cross – Gym

Another long-standing tradition, our eighth grade students perform a moving rendition of Jesus’ journey to his crucifixion for all grades and their families.

Tiger Gala –Activity Center

All parents, parishioners and friends are invited to this important Sacred Heart Home and School fundraiser. Spend a fun-filled evening of great food and fellowship, including live music as well as a silent and live auction.

Art Show and Choir Concerts – Church & Parish Hall

Our school choir will perform prior to 11 a.m. Mass. The Art Show will open from 10 a.m. until 1:30 p.m. in the Parish Hall.

May Crowning – Church

This prayer service honoring the Blessed Mother is led by our second grade students who form an arch of flowers as Mary is crowned. All students are invited to present a flower for Mary and families are encouraged to attend.

Eighth Grade vs. Teachers Lip Sync Competition – School Gym

One of our newest traditions that is very popular with our school community, the Lip Sync Competition is a fun way to stock our Sacred Heart St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry. Eighth-graders square off against faculty in performances for students and guests. Students then vote for their favorite performance by donating food to either the eighth grade food cart or the faculty food cart. The group collecting the greatest amount of food is declared the Lip Sync Champions!

Spring Pep Rally and Eighth Grade vs. Teachers Volleyball Game – School Gym

All parents are invited to show your school spirit. Cheerleaders perform and our spring athletes are recognized for their accomplishments. Immediately following will be the annual teachers vs. eighth grade volleyball game.
