

Where's Your Heat Pocket? (How to take your child's temperature correctly.)

As the flu rages on in Baton Rouge, I don't think we can talk about staying well and what to do if someone in your family gets sick. Our area is listed as "very high and spreading" for the number and severity of flu cases. Yikes!

A hallmark of the flu and other winter illnesses are often a fever. Taking your child's temperature gives you and your health provider helpful information only if you take it correctly.


It's all about the heat pockets

If someone asked you to point at the heat pockets in your mouth, would you know where to point? If you were to vaguely wave at some general spot beneath your tongue, this email is for you! (And, P.S., you're not alone

For adults and older kids, your thermometer is best used orally. That would account for most of our students. For little ones younger than 4 years old, your thermometer can be used rectally and under the arm.

Heat Pockets

(place thermometer here, under tongue)



Here's the trick to finding those heat pockets:

- Avoid placing the probe tip right under the middle of your tongue. Instead, aim for the left or right, right where the base of your tongue meets the bottom of your mouth.
- For maximally accurate readings, use the same side of your tongue every time.
- Once your thermometer is placed, relax your tongue, and seal your lips.
- Wait a few seconds and voila there's your reading!

Best Practices for Taking Oral Temperatures:

- Wait 2-3 minutes between readings. This allows the probe tip to fully cool after being in contact with your warm body.
- Avoid taking temperatures after bathing or vigorous exercise both activities can elevate your temperature!
- Before you start your reading, make sure it's been 15 minutes since you last ate or drank. Both activities can artificially increase the temperature of your mouth.

Kinsa, with the support of Lysol, has been helping schools for over 8 years to stop the spread of illness. Our school will be receiving FREE smart thermometers to distribute to our school community!

Once you receive a thermometer from our school, all you need to do is follow these instructions to join our school group:



Step 1

Download the free Kinsa app by scanning the QR code found on the box or searching for **Kinsa** in your app store





Step 2

Create an account and join your school




Step 3

Connect your thermometer to get illness updates from your school





By signing up and activating your thermometer, our school also has a chance to receive free Lysol disinfectant wipes for our classrooms!

Not only that, the app will provide age-appropriate health guidance when a family member gets sick. Our school has a private dashboard that shows illness trends in the community so that we can stop the spread of illness together — and don't worry, any data contributed to the app is fully protected and private.



SJA OFFERS MERIT-BASED AWARDS




Since our founding in 1868 by the Sisters of St. Joseph, St. Joseph's Academy has been a place where young women explore their interests, find their passions and discover their unique gifts. The 1868 Award celebrates the exceptional achievements of young women in an area or activity of particular interest to them, including but not limited to the arts, service. community involvement, the STEM disciplines, leadership or extracurricular activities.

The 1868 Award provides \$1,868 toward freshman-year tuition for 10-12 incoming 9th graders.

Named in honor of St. Joseph's Academy's first graduate, Josephine Bahlinger, class of 1877,


this \$4,000 award toward freshmanyear tuition will be given to five incoming 9th grade students.





This award is named in honor of St. Joseph's Academy's first principal, Mother Alice Biguenet. She came to SJA in 1926 and taught until 1930, when she was named principal. (Prior to that, the Superior directed the school as well as the convent and orphanage.) Mother Alice was the builder of the Broussard Street campus. Award winners will be chosen because they exemplify the SJA motto of Sanctity, Joy and Action.

The Mother Alice Award provides \$3,000 toward freshmanyear tuition for five incoming 9th grade students.
