





American Academy of Pediatrics Report Concerns Over Pediatric Hospitalizations from the Triple Threat and Joining the Sacred Heart School Smart Thermometer Community

As of today, 70% of all pediatric hospital beds are full in this country. This is happening in large part to three illnesses. They are COVID-19, flu, and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV).

What do health officials mean by a "triple health threat"?

Health officials have been referring to the combination of RSV, COVID-19, and flu as a "triple threat" because they are all circulating simultaneously and could all fuel a spike in respiratory illnesses now and in the coming months. "It is concerning to see three respiratory viruses, all of which are very contagious, all of which are rising at the same time," said the American Academy of Pediatrics. At the early stages of the COVID-19 pandemic, we heard about the importance of 'flattening the curve' to preserve hospital bed capacity. This would be the same issue, but instead of COVID-19 as the only 'driver,' it would potentially be driven by all three respiratory viruses.

What is respiratory syncytial virus (RSV)?

Respiratory syncytial virus, or RSV, is a respiratory virus that usually causes cold-like symptoms, including a runny nose, poor appetite, coughing, sneezing, fever, and wheezing. The virus can spread via coughs, sneezes, surfaces, and direct contact, according to the CDC. Most people who get infected experience mild symptoms and recover within a week or two, but the virus "can be serious, especially for infants and older adults," the CDC says. "Each year in the United States, an estimated 58,000 children younger than 5 years old are hospitalized due to RSV infection," the CDC says on its website.

Why has RSV been in the news recently?

While RSV usually circulates in the late fall, winter and spring, the U.S. has seen an early surge in pediatric RSV cases this year that has put a strain on hospitals. We have now had a couple of winters of people being more careful than usual, masking and staying in, and so people have had less exposure to flu and respiratory syncytial virus for a couple of years, our immune systems are, a little bit, in a lower state of response for these pathogens.

Where do COVID-19 and flu stand currently?

Covid 19 infections climbed from 3.9 to 6.2 per 100000. In Louisiana in 3 weeks. That sounds like a low number, but 90% of all people are testing with at home kits and are not reported in the official numbers.

Cases of Flu are considered very high for our area.

How can you tell which virus you or your child has?


Distinguishing between the viruses' symptoms can be difficult, health care providers say. If you have any symptoms, you must assume that it is one of these three things. Most illnesses, whether respiratory illnesses or in cold and flu season, most kids are fine at home, but always, always be on the lookout for difficulty breathing, a fever that lasts longer than three days, or a fever in a kid who's younger than two months.

What can we do to prevent illness?

- While there is no vaccine to prevent RSV, only preventive treatments are given to high-risk children under the age of 2.
- Get kids vaccinated, because if you can get them vaccinated against the flu and COVID that takes two of the issues off the table.
- Consider a well-fitting, good-quality mask, especially indoors or in crowded spaces.
- Wash hands thoroughly and often.
- Use hand sanitizers, if unable to wash hands.
- Stay away from sick people.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Clean commonly touched surfaces.
- If you are sick, stay home and avoid contact with others.

Arm yourself with information:

Sacred Heart School has been accepted into the Kinsa Smart Thermometer Program. Kinsa has provided us with a free smart thermometer for every family. Not only can you have an electronic record for your children's temperature, but you can also see trends in Covid and the flu in our area, health messages from me and lots of other resources.
