

What is an Acute Appendicitis?

In the last month, three children I know have had an appendicitis. Whether this diagnosis is more common in recent times or this is just a fluke, I'm not sure. I remember seeing a tv show when I was a child where a kid always faked a stomach ache. In the true "cry wolf" fashion, he once had a real stomach ache and no one believed him. It was an appendicitis! He was rushed to the hospital and into surgery with parents vowing never to doubt the child again. The next thing you saw was him sitting up in a hospital bed eating popsicles. "That didn't look so bad," I thought. A real appendicitis is a medical problem that should not be dismissed.

Who is at risk?

Although anyone can develop appendicitis, it most often occurs in people between the ages of 10 and 30.

What is an appendicitis?

It is the inflammation of the appendix, a finger-shaped pouch present at the lower right side of the abdomen.



Signs and symptoms of appendicitis may include:

- Sudden pain in your lower right abdomen. However, in most people, pain begins around the navel and then moves. As inflammation worsens, appendicitis pain typically increases and eventually becomes severe.
- Pain that worsens if you cough, walk or make other jarring movements
- Nausea and vomiting
- · Loss of appetite
- Low-grade fever
- · Constipation or diarrhea
- Abdominal bloating
- Flatulence

Causes

Appendicitis occurs when the opening of the appendix is blocked, or due to infection. Thirty percent of appendicitis cases in children have a family history (someone else in their family has had one.)

Diagnosis

To help diagnose appendicitis, your doctor will take a history of your signs and symptoms and examine your abdomen. Tests and procedures used to diagnose appendicitis include:

- Physical exam to assess your pain.
 - Your doctor may apply gentle pressure on the painful area. When the pressure is suddenly released, appendicitis pain will often feel worse, signaling that the adjacent peritoneum is inflamed.
- Blood test. This allows your doctor to check for a high white blood cell count, which may indicate an infection.
- **Urine test.** Your doctor may want you to have a urinalysis to make sure that a urinary tract infection or a kidney stone isn't causing your pain.
- Imaging tests. Your doctor may also recommend an abdominal X-ray (to exclude other causes), an abdominal

ultrasound, computerized tomography (CT) scan or magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) to help confirm appendicitis or find other causes of pain.

Treatment

Appendicitis treatment usually involves surgery to remove the inflamed appendix...

Complications

Appendicitis can cause serious complications, such as:

· A ruptured (burst) appendix.


A rupture spreads infection throughout your abdomen. Possibly life-threatening, this condition requires immediate surgery to remove the appendix and clean your abdominal cavity.

• A pocket of pus that forms in the abdomen.

If your appendix bursts, you may develop a pocket of infection (abscess). In most cases, a surgeon drains the abscess by placing a tube to drain the abscess. Once the infection is clear, the appendix can be removed. While stomach aches in children are common, report any serious symptoms above to your doctor.






