

This wonderful film, narrated by Bishop Hying of Madison, helps us understand the beauty of pilgrimage by walking step-by-step with those who have traversed this ancient route. Increase in Developmental Disabilities Among Children in the United States

One of my best friends always say, "Normal is a setting on a dryer." She uses that saying to refer to people. Isn't it true? We are all made in the image and likeness of God unique and different. Nowhere is it more evident than with children. They grow and develop at their own pace.

The American Academy Pediatrics have been studying the development of children for a long time. Their studies include how often developmental disabilities were diagnosed among children in the United States, and trends over time. In one particular study, scientists from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) found that one in six children from 3–17 years had a developmental disability. Healthcare providers can use these findings to better understand the trends associated with the diagnosis of developmental disabilities and to plan for medical, educational, and social services to support children and their families. Just like that one size fits all beach cover-ups, one approach in development does not fit all (please refer to the dryer reference above.)

Main Findings:

- About 1 in 6 (17%) children aged 3-17 years were diagnosed with a developmental disability, as reported by parents;
- In the study population, some groups of children were more likely to have been diagnosed with a developmental disability than others, such as:
 - Boys compared to girls.
 - Non-Hispanic white and non-Hispanic black children compared to Hispanic children or non-Hispanic children
 of other races:
 - Children living in rural areas compared to children living in urban areas; and
 - Children with public health insurance compared to uninsured children and children with private insurance.
- This percentage of children aged 3-17 years diagnosed with a developmental disability doubled from 2009 to 2017.
 - Specifically, diagnoses increased for attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), autism spectrum disorder (ASD), and intellectual disabilities (ID).

The reasons for these increases were not examined in the current study, but previous research has found improved awareness, screening, diagnosis, and service accessibility may contribute to the increases seen.

About the Study:

Parents were asked whether a doctor or other healthcare provider ever told them their child had any of the following developmental disabilities:

- Attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder.
- Autism spectrum disorder
- Blindness
- Cerebral palsy
- Moderate-to-profound hearing loss
- Learning disability
- Intellectual disability
- Seizure in the past 12 months
- Stuttering or stammering in the past 12 months
- Any other developmental delay

If a parent answered "yes" to their child having at least one of these, their child was considered to have a developmental disability. The authors also looked at the data according to sex, age, race and ethnicity, health insurance coverage, birthweight, maternal education, federal poverty level, and urbanicity of residence.

What this research proves is that more research is needed because different is normal.

How do I know what level my student earned?


A note will be sent home Monday, April 24th letting you and your child know how many points they have earned and what "level" they will have on Destroy the Dress Code Day.
