The safety of your children is our highest priority. It is imperative that carpool procedures are strictly observed.

#### MORNING DROP-OFF PROCEDURES

- Students may be dropped off as early as 7 a.m. only if they are enrolled in the Before-School Program. Parents may drop students off in front of the cafeteria until 7:25 a.m.
- Students not enrolled in the Before-School Program may not enter the school grounds until the 7:25 a.m. bell rings. If a child is dropped off before 7:25 a.m., the student is *required* to go to the Before-School Program and the parent will be charged for the Before-School service.
- For all students, use the carpool lane which is located on Main Street adjacent to the school sidewalk. Please enter the carpool lane from behind the church to prevent Main Street from getting backed up. *Pull up as far as possible* (to the crosswalk) before letting your child out of the car. Students will exit the car on the passenger side. Please make sure that you are in the car lane before unloading. *Do not drop students off in the street*. Once the child has exited the car and the door is closed, you must drive forward through the lane and turn onto North 22nd Street.
- Students should have all books and materials in hand when they exit the vehicle. Parents *should not* exit the vehicle to help their child.

#### AFTERNOON PICK-UP PROCEDURES

- Please make sure that your family carpool tag is displayed prominently in the front window or from the rear view mirror until your child has entered your vehicle.
- > For all students, use the carpool lane which is located on Main Street adjacent to the school sidewalk.
  - Parents should line up for carpool behind Sacred Heart of Jesus Church by entering the parking lot off Main Street. Cars arriving early will pull forward in the driveway east of the church, then cars will line up in three separate lines behind the church and parish hall. One car from each line will move forward, beginning with the line closest to the church and parish hall, then the second, then the third line.
  - A faculty member will call your child for pick-up and other faculty members will be placing your child into the car on the *passenger's side only*. Once the child has entered the car and the door is closed, you must drive through the school yard and turn right onto Main Street.
  - Note: The first 4 spots in carpool are reserved spaces. Please leave them open for the families that purchased these spots at the school auction.
- Students will not be released to parents who walk over to the school grounds; parents must use the carpool lines.

# Mandatory Vision Screening for Grades Pre-K 3, PreK 4, K, 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th,</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> Grade-Even if You Have an Eye Doctor Consent Forms are Due Now (All other grades are encouraged but not required to participate.)

Good vision plays an important role in your child's education. For that reason, **students in Louisiana are required to receive vision screening** <u>at school</u> **in Pre-K, Kindergarten, 1st, 3rd, 5th, and 7th grade.** All other grades participation are optional. Many childhood eye problems can be improved if identified and treated before age eight.

This is our 5th year, partnering with the Lion's Club as they screen our students using the Plusoptix screener. Their Cub Sight Program is available this year (for kids under 6) and their new Sight for Kids Program (for kids over 6). Advantages of the Plusoptics screener include greater reliability than manual screening in a fraction of the time. The Plusoptix screener uses infrared light that is totally harmless to the child's eyes. Screening is performed one meter away from the child in less than one second. The student's face covering remains on during screening. This device provides simultaneous measurement of both eyes (binocular). Screening does not rely on the student's ability to concentrate on the screening, respond to screening questions or have dilated eyes. This also creates a socially distant acceptable method of screening that is a very low risk to our students.

This is a mandatory screening for students in Pre-K, Kindergarten, 1st, 3rd, 5th, and 7<sup>th</sup> grade. Because the Lion's Club is not a part of regular Sacred Heart Faculty and Staff, a signed consent must be filled out and returned to school before the screening. Please fill out the consent form attached. Sacred Heart staff always monitors the screening. The screening will occur later this month. Please return your student's consent form no later than Wednesday, September 13th. If you object to this screening, you must opt out in writing. The information obtained from this vision screening is preliminary and does not constitute a complete vision exam. It is designed to potentially detect eye problems such as myopia (near-sightedness), hyperopia (far-sightedness), astigmatism (not seeing things in focus), strabismus (eyes point in different directions), amblyopia (lazy eye), or anisocoria (different size pupils).</li> <li>2. There is no charge to participate in the vision screening. The screener stands approximately 3-4 feet away from your child.</li> <li>3. The LLEF CubSight screener or volunteer may take a picture of my child which could possibly be used in future CubSight promotions.</li> <li>4. If my child is referred, I am responsible for arranging a complete eye exam by a vision professional.</li> <li>5. If my child is referred, and examined by a vision care professional, the examiner should release the results of my child's exam to the CubSight Program and to my child's school/day-care. These results may not remain confidential as they will be shared with my child's school/day-care administration, the CubSight office staff, and participating Lions Clubs.</li> <li>6. # Lab Services Program

The Lab Services Program is a division of the Department of Special Education that focuses on dyslexia therapy and reading intervention. Students who are currently enrolled at their school and either have a diagnosis of dyslexia or are recommended by the school administration due to struggles in reading can apply for Lab Services.

# How does the Lab Services Program help the students?

- It is designed to meet the students where they are and bring them up to grade-level in reading fluency, comprehension, writing and spelling with an additional handwriting component if necessary.
- Deficits are identified through diagnostic assessment.
- A multisensory and systematic approach is used to teaching reading and spelling concepts. Our lab teachers also collaborate with the students' classroom teachers to best meet the needs of each child.

# How often do students attend Lab Services?

Students will be pulled strategically throughout the day in order to attend the lab. Depending on the class period length, it will be 2-3 times per week for 100-120 minutes. Students may be pulled in a group of up to 4 students. Depending on the degree of the reading deficit, it can be a 2-3-year course of instruction.

# What are the fees for Lab Services?

The fees are \$3000/year with a \$75 registration fee. Payments of \$300 will be drafted from your bank account at the beginning of each month. If a child enters the lab mid-month, fees will be pro-rated.

# How to I apply for Lab Services?

- 1. School administration, in accordance with the classroom teacher, will meet with the family to determine if the child would benefit from the lab.
- If the family would like to apply for the program or has any further questions, they should email Kristy Monsour, Program Director of the Department of Special Education (kmonsour@csobr.org), for the digital application and bank draft information.
- 3. Once application, banking information and registration fees are received, Kristy will notify the school and parents that services can begin.
- 4. If there is an educational evaluation for the child that would help with reading remediation, it should also be submitted.
