**ARETE SCHOLARS** provides private K-12 scholarships exclusively to qualifying low-to-moderate-income students. The scholarships empower parents who otherwise have limited options to select a school that best meets their child's unique gifts, talents, and learning needs.

**Maximum scholarship amounts:** \$4,350 for grades K-8; or \$4,900 for grades 9-12.

**Application period:** February 27, 2024 through May 31, 2024 (or sooner if application limit reaches 3,200)

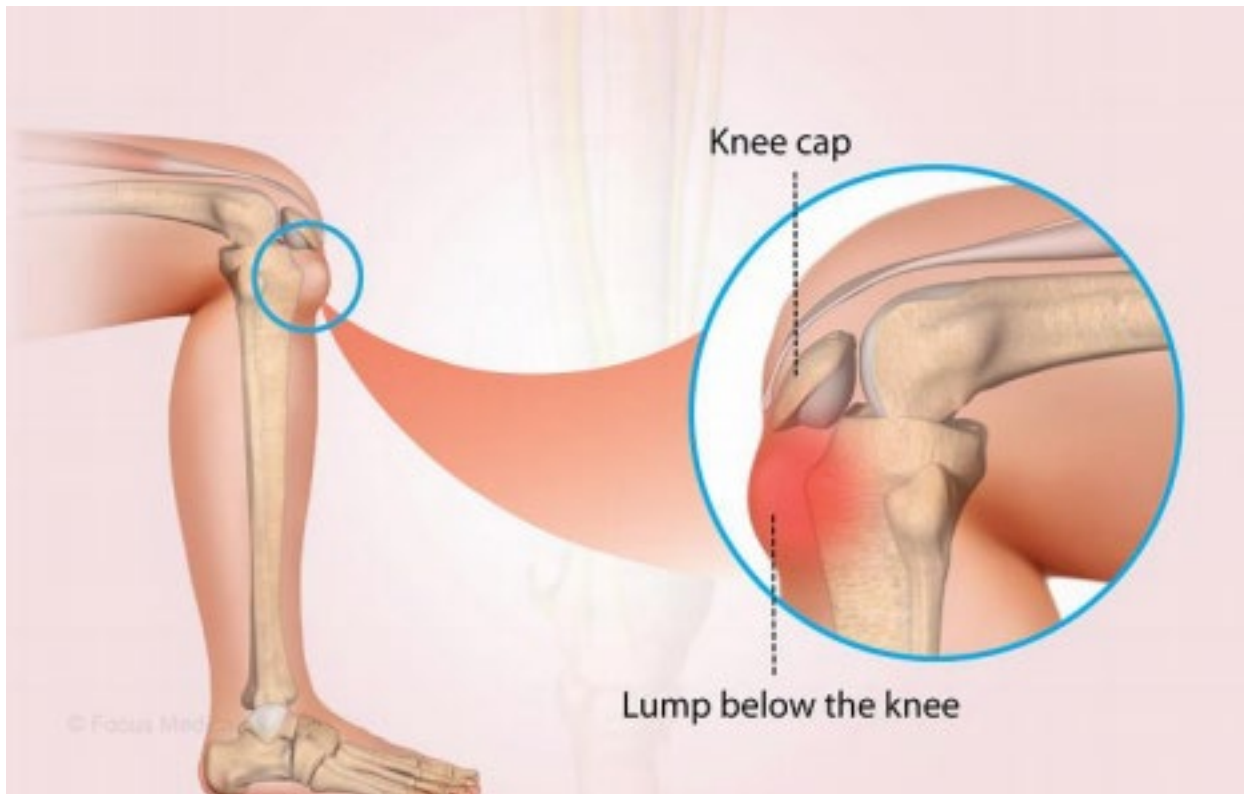

## **A Look at Osgood Schlatter Disease**

“Mom, my knee really hurts.” The next question from mom is “What did you do to it?” The answer is usually “nothing.” Many aches and pains afflict our children’s growing bodies. The majority are nothing to worry about. One situation that can happen and is worth mentioning is Osgood Schlatter Disease. That sounds terrible, doesn’t it? The name is worse than the actual problem, but some kids have a hard time until a growth spurt passes. It involves inflammation of the area just below knee causing pain, especially in growing children. It usually occurs in children who participate in sports that involve running and jumping such as soccer, basketball etc.



### **General**

- Diagnosed by medical professional.
- Requires lab test or imaging.
- Can last several months.
- More common in males
- It mostly occurs during growth spurts when bones, muscle and other structures are growing and changing rapidly.
- It usually gets resolved when child’s bones stop growing.
- Those who are active in sports and athletics are more prone to it.

### **Symptoms**

- Pain in the lower part of the knee
- Swelling or tenderness
- Increased warmth under the knee and over the shinbone
- Worsening of Pain while running, exercising or any stressing activities
- Limping after physical activity
- Tight muscles in front or back of thigh
- It mostly affects one knee.



## Causes

Osgood Schlatter Disease is primarily an overuse injury. The following factors can increase the chance of occurrence:

- High stress activities like running, jumping, and bending.
- Rigorous exercise
- Puberty's growth spurt
- Active participation in athletics and sports

## The risk factors include:

- Age - it occurs during growth spurts.
- Gender - more common in boys

## Diagnosis

- Physical examination Physical examination of swelling, tenderness, and pain.
- X-ray To take a close look of knee and bones.
- MRI To rule out other conditions with similar symptoms.

## Treatments

- Resolves itself when growth of bone stops.

## Prevention

There is no way to completely prevent Osgood Schlatter disease, but measures can be taken to minimize the possibility of occurrence -

- Stretching exercises to counteract inflexibility occurring at times of rapid growth in adolescents.
- Slowly and cautiously increase the intensity and duration of sports activities.

## Questions To Ask Your Doctor

- Does the child need to completely stop all physical activities?
- Does the child need to change his / her preference in the sport?
- Are there any complications?
- When can the child get back to his / her normal routine?

## Nutrition

Some studies suggest diet can help:

Take rich and nutritious diet with calcium and proteins.

## The Takeaway:

We know a lot more about things that aggravate growing children. Most of these irritations do not have any long-lasting effects. Call your pediatrician if your child complains of the above symptoms for longer than three days. They may need a doctor's visit if there are no other explanations for their knee pain.

My sympathies go out to all of the parents who seem to be continually buying longer skirts or pants and bigger tennis shoes this Spring. Your child will stop growing at some point in the future!
